

You may have questions about how to get at-home COVID-19 test kits. With EpiphanyRx, you have options!

1. Visit your local pharmacy, including national and regional chains

- Using your Pharmacy Benefit ID Card, your pharmacy may be able to process your test kits at no charge through your benefit plan at the pharmacy counter, or
- Get reimbursed up to \$12 per test by sending your receipts to us, along with the COVID-19 OTC Test Claim Form, located at www.epiphanyrx.com/resources

2. Get free federal or state issued at-home tests

- For federally-supplied tests, go to www.covidtests.gov or call 800.232.0233 (TTY 888.720.7489).
- You can also get state issued at-home tests through your state public health department. For information about your state, go to www.cdc.gov/publichealthgateway/healthdirectories/healthdepartments.html. Many states have pick up sites through health clinics, community centers and local libraries.

3. Check out Direct-to-Consumer options available through select pharmacies

For our members, test kits are free through the following mail order pharmacies. You may be responsible for any additional shipping charges, if applicable.

- Select Mail Order
- Register for a new account
 - You do not need to be a Costco member to use their mail order service
- Select: Fill New Prescription
- Select: “My Doctor will Call or Fax. I do not have a written prescription”
- In the Physician Info Fields:
 - Enter Physicians Name: Costco Test
 - Enter Physicians Phone: (800) 111-1111
 - Enter Physician City: Seattle
 - Enter Physician State: WA
 - Enter Drug Information: COVID Tests

4. Purchase at retailers including grocery stores, warehouse stores, and online shopping sites

- When you purchase at-home tests at retailers or online sites, use the COVID-19 OTC Test Claim Form, at www.epiphanyrx.com/resources to get reimbursed.
- Test availability may vary by location, dependent on supply and active COVID-19 infections in your region. If one option is not available for at-home test kits, please try another option or use COVID testing sites in your area.
- These options meet federal requirements for health plans, but may not include coverage for Medicare or Medicaid.
